ROAD & BRIDGE

The Lockport Township Board of Trustees met at the Lockport Township Government Building, Community Center, 1463 S. Farrell Road, Lockport, Illinois on Tuesday June 12, 2018 at 7:12 PM with Supervisor Ron Alberico presiding.

Present were Clerk Denise Mushro Rumchak, Assessor Debbi Mason, Highway Commissioner John Cielenski, Trustees Barb Boyce, Barb Delaney and Dean Morelli, Collector Karen Johnson, Attorney Gary Mueller and Deputy Clerk Jessica Strickland. Also present were Delinda Herod, Bob Loewe and Grant Spooner filming the meeting. Absent was Trustee Gregg Bickus. The meeting agenda was posted at the Lockport & Crest Hill Libraries, Lockport Township Government Building, the Lockport Township website (Clerk's section), the calendar and also on the Community Center door.

On a Motion of Boyce, seconded by Delaney to approve the minutes from the previous regular monthly meeting held on May 8, 2018 and the Public Hearing held on May 8, 2018.

On a Motion of Boyce, seconded by Delaney to approve total bills and payroll in the amount of \$82,419.43. Roll call vote resulted in Alberico Aye, Boyce Aye, Delaney Aye and Morelli Aye.

Citizens Wishing to Address the Board- Delinda Herod mentioned to Commissioner Cielenski that on the corner of Rosalind Street and Briggs Street and also the corner of Oak Avenue and Briggs Street, the grass is very tall and is causing a safety concern. Commissioner Cielenski commented that those particular areas are maintained by the City of Lockport and he will inform them of the issue.

Commissioner's Report-

- Commissioner Cielenski stated he was presented for the initial phase of the website in the Clerk's office, but he felt that his attendance was not necessary for the selection of the layout and homepage elements.
- The employees have been cutting grass nonstop due to the amount precipitation the Township has received.
- The schedule for branch pick up has been delayed due to the ongoing rain. The Highway Department will be picking up the branches in these areas as soon as possible.
- Commissioner Cielenski informed the residents that Will County Land Use has accepted a construction company's bid to perform the work needed for phase two of the flood study. Commissioner Cielenski believes that they have decided to construct two retention ponds, one by the Community Center and one on the corner of Barry Avenue and Green Garden Place. Will County Land Use hopes to have phase two and three completed by the end of the year.
- The Highway Department would like to finance a new truck. Commissioner Cielenski explained that the cost of repairs is averaging around \$65,000 a year.
- The Highway Department attended the Touch A Truck event at Dellwood Park. The plow truck that was present for the event was painted entirely yellow and the children were allowed to place their painted hands on the vehicle. The paint colors were red, white and blue for the children to choose from.

Supervisor Alberico stated that the Prevailing Wage Ordinance No. 2018-3 for the Highway Department needs to be approved.

On a Motion of Delaney, seconded by Boyce to approve Ordinance No. 2018-3 (Prevailing Wage Act). Roll call vote resulted in Alberico Aye, Boyce Aye, Delaney Aye and Morelli Aye.

On a Motion of Boyce, seconded by Delaney to adjourn the meeting at 7:21 PM.
