ROAD & BRIDGE

The Lockport Township Board of Trustees met in the Central Square Board Room 318, 222 East Ninth Street, Lockport, Illinois on Monday May 9, 2016 at 7:00 PM with Supervisor Ron Alberico presided.

Present were Trustees, John Batusich, Barb Boyce, Mike Lewandowski, Dean Morelli, Clerk Denise Mushro Rumchak, Highway Commissioner John Cielenski, Collector Lance McCalla, Deputy Clerk Jessica Strickland and Grant Spooner filming the meeting. Absent were Assessor Debbi Mason and Attorney Gary Mueller. The meeting agenda were posted at the Lockport & Crest Hill Libraries, the Joilet Herald News, at the Central Square Building, on the Township website (Clerk's section) and also on the Board Room door.

On a Motion of Boyce, seconded by Batusich, to approve the minutes from the previous meetings as presented for the regular monthly meeting April 11, 2016 and Workshop meeting April 25, 2016.

MOTION CARRIED

On a Motion of Lewandowski, seconded by Boyce to approve total bills and payroll in the amount of \$106,541.20. Roll call vote resulted in Alberico Aye, Batusich Aye, Boyce Aye, Lewandowski Aye, and Morelli Aye.

Commissioner's report- Things are going well.

- * Paving project was completed. The shoulder curb still needs to be done. Highway Commissioner asked residents to be patient.
- * Com Ed is in the process of installing a street light that was requested by a resident in Fairmont.
- * Seasonal employees will begin working in two weeks.
- * Highway Department will start mowing grass next week.
- * Culverts are being done from last year. Only one a day can be completed. Highway Commissioner asked for residents to be patient. They will get to the culverts as quickly as possible.
- * Highway department has proceeded with branch pick up.

Supervisor Alberico announced that the Public Hearing for 2016/2017 budget will be held on Monday May 16, 2016 at 6:45 PM. Clerk Rumchak asked Commissioner Cielenski if the budget was put on the website under Highway Department.

Clerk Rumchak addressed a resident's concern about flooding on her property in the Bonnie Brae subdivision. Clerk Rumchak requested Commissioner Cielenski to contact the resident. Commissioner Cielenski commented that he is aware of the situation and is in the process of trying to find a solution to the problem. The resident's house is located at the lowest part of the street. The City of Lockport and an engineer evaluated the area in question and declined the request of installing a 10 foot pipe to connect to the storm water and the treated water together. Commissioner Cielenski replied that he has not forgotten

about the resident's concern and is in the process of obtaining designs for the situation without a high cost.

Commissioner Cielenski informed the Board that there is flooding on Bruce Road due a farm field in this area and is currently being addressed.

Clerk Rumchak requested the letter from FEMA grant documentation for securing funding for the culvert replacement and also information pertaining to the bids to purchase equipment from Currie Motor. Commissioner Cielennski replied that all equipment purchases were involved with the Will County Governmental League and he will obtain the information.

Collector McCalla questioned a bill for a high amount listed as Torima. Commissionner Cielenski answered that Torima is an insurance company which is part of TOI with coverage for any situation and generally they receive a refund check at the end of the year.

On a Motion of Batusich seconded by Boyce to adjourn the meeting at 7:13 PM.
